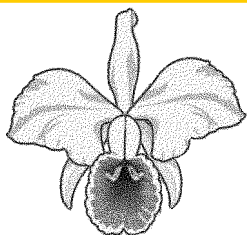

Conditions of Entry

1. Initial class places are tentative until all results are collated and finalised the following day.
2. Entries are received upon the basis that the Society or its sponsors shall not be responsible for any loss, destruction nor damage to such exhibits and the exhibitor shall have no claim against the Society or Sponsors.
3. Entries are accepted on condition that they are disease free. The decision of the President or Show Marshal shall be final.
4. All competitive entries shall have been owned and in the possession of the exhibitor for the preceding six months.
5. All competitive entries should be correctly and clearly labelled with the name of the plant.
6. There shall be no restriction to the number of entries by an exhibitor in any class. Entries in joint names will be accepted.
7. The Show Marshal and Committee reserve the right to reject, remove or rearrange any exhibit without giving any reason for that action and to reclassify any plant if necessary, prior to judging.
8. All plants shall be booked in and in position ready for judging by 11am on Wed 27th July & 24th August 2011.
9. Entries are eligible for judging in one class only, except where stated otherwise in the schedule.
10. If in the opinion of the Judges no exhibit in any class warrants a *prize, none may be given*. At the discretion of the Show Marshal additional classes may be created where warranted.
11. Plants for special prizes shall be selected from all exhibits in the show unless otherwise specified.
12. Judging shall be by a panel of Judges nominated by the O.S.N.S.W. Registrar and shall be in accordance with the standards and by-laws laid down by the O.S.N.S.W. Inc. **The Judges decision shall be final.**
13. No exhibit may be dismantled or removed prior to closing time of the show at **4pm on 31st July or 28th August 2011.**
14. **'Novice'** shall mean: Any exhibitor until she/he has won the yearly point score in the monthly competition of this society, or becomes an open class competitor in any other society.
15. **'Seedling'** shall mean the complete plant grown from seed and flowered for the first time. Plants that have been grown on or divided prior to being exhibited on the show bench are not eligible to be shown as seedlings. For exhibition purposes seedlings shall retain their status of 'Seedling' throughout the flowering season in which they first flower. Mericlones are not eligible as seedlings.
16. **'Miniature species'** are defined as Orchids with flowers 15mm or under in size across the widest part of the flower, regardless of the number of flowers, and distance of < 200mm from 1st to last flower. All 'Miniature' species are to be judged in this class.
17. **'Miniature Cymbidium Hybrids'** are defined for the purpose of this schedule as Cymbidiums where the flowers are 55mm or less, to be measured horizontally across the visible limits of the flower without manipulation and are miniature in habit.

18. **'Laeliinae Alliance'** classes shall include all combinations and not only those hybrids with Cattleya in their parentage. E.g. Epidendrum, Sophronitis, Laelia, Hawkinsara, Cattleyatonia, Leptotes etc.
19. Staking shall be in accordance with the rules of O.S.N.S.W. i.e. flowers may be supported in the best possible manner for presentation. This supporting should be in such a manner so as not to be obtrusive and distract from the overall beauty and charm of the plant. With single flowered genera e.g. Paphiopedilum, Lycaste, etc., ties or support shall be no higher than immediately below the ovary. If it is necessary to tie above the bottom flower or top branch, the judges are permitted to penalise, or temporarily remove such tie for the purpose of judging.
20. The cover for plants under protection for humidity must be transparent.
21. Champion seedling is not to be considered for Grand Champion unless it has already won the Champion in its class.
22. Plants offered for sale at the show must be free of disease and pests, offered at a maximum rate of \$85 or less and sold or rejected for sale at the discretion of the President or the Presidents representative.
23. Only members who have benched plants in this show may offer plants for sale. The commission charged by the Bankstown Orchid Society for the sale of members plants will be 15% from those members who provide a minimum of 4 hours supervision at the venue, or 20% from members who do not attend. The supervision required to avoid the extra commission will not include the day of set up or the day of dismantling. Please ensure that you sign on and off in the attendance book, and report to the Committee member 'in charge' at that time.

The Hairy Dendrobiums

Which are the Hairy Dendrobiums?

The title of 'Hairy Dendrobiums' can be applied to all the members of the *Formosae* section of the genus *Dendrobium*. If you have been growing orchids for some time, or you are reading some older publications you will see plants in this section are referred to as Dendrobiums of the *Negro-hirsute* section. I think this was a better section name for these orchids as it described the characteristic that all plants in this section have black, or near-black hairs on their canes, particularly the new growths, i.e. *Negro* meaning black and *hirsute* meaning hairy. Some species even have the hairs on the underside of the leaves and on the flower sheaves.

Plants in this section can be found from India, through South East Asia to Sumatra, the Philippines and Borneo, but they do not occur any further east than Borneo. The main centre of distribution of plants in this section appears to be from India to Indochina and Thailand, where 20 species are found and Borneo and the Philippines where 12 species are found.

Nomenclature-wise most of the species in this section have been very stable and have not suffered several name changes or movement between sections as have many other Dendrobiums. Because of this the number of species attributed to this section by different authorities is very close, between 30 and 36 seems to be an accepted number. However, only 3 or 4 species are commonly seen benched, although there are many hybrids available to the orchid grower.

Why is growing these plants popular?

To orchid growers and hybridisers, members of the *Formosae* group offer several appealing characteristics such as:

1. Many are summer flowering
2. Many species have a pleasant fragrance and this is often passed onto their progeny.
3. Many species have a compact growing habit which is also passed onto their progeny.
4. Some of the species have yellow, green or red colourations and this is often passed onto their progeny.
5. The flowers are long lasting, most up to 6 weeks or even longer even the paper thin white flowers of *Den formosum* and *Den. infundibulum* will last a month or more. This trait is often passed onto their progeny.
6. Many of the species are definitely cool growers.
7. Those that are naturally warm growers impart warmth tolerance to their progeny when bred to cool growers.
8. When crossed, many of the resulting progeny are rapid growers and will flower within three years out of the flask.

Cultivation

With the exception of a few species, all Dendrobiums are primarily epiphytic including those in the *Formosae* section. This means that plants in this section can be cultivated in a pot and a number will also grow mounted. Most of these plants like to be grown in bright filtered light.

Plants in the *Formosae* section are evergreen species and they do not experience dormancy at any time during the year, although the majority enjoy a drier rest period in winter, when they should be allowed to dry out between waterings. However, they should not be allowed to remain completely dry for more than a few days. Plants generally enjoy a drop in temperature in winter and although they do not experience freezing temperatures in nature, by keeping them drier and having some overhead protection, I have been able to keep them growing in a cold house with the temperature has fallen to around 3°C.

Possibly the best conditions to grow them in are the same as for Cattleyas, although best flowering is achieved when they are subjected to a slightly colder winter temperature. One thing to be avoided is overwatering just as the new growths are maturing.

These comments are very general for the group and many of the more unusual species can have very specific cultural requirements, so some careful research should be undertaken to find the exact requirements for any particular species.

In just about all cases the plants flower from short apical nodes.

Potting

The majority of this section can be grown in pots. I use the deep port pots - the same as for my softcane Dendrobiums. The medium used should be very free draining and, as they resent being disturbed, repotting should only be carried out when the medium has started to decompose and the drainage and air circulation to the root zone is impaired. If the plant is so large that it required dividing, divide it into substantial pieces as it will not like being broken up into small sections.

Fertilizing

These plants receive the same fertilizer as all my other plants in the collection. I use the HSO fertilizer, alternating between HS012 and HSO22 throughout the year. Every 2 months I add Hysan to the fertilizer. I also add Seasol to the fertilizer on the first week of each month as a root stimulant. Additionally I give the plants a level teaspoon of Epsom salts in 5 litres of water in September and April.

Watering

All my plants in this section are in a cold glass house and this house receives a watering all year round, with the amount and timing of watering regulated by the season. As this house can get down to under 5°C regularly during winter, I tend to keep all the plants in this house, not only the Dendrobiums, on the drier side, allowing them to dry out for short periods during the coldest parts of winter.

Pests

I find Dendrobiums in this section relatively free of most of the usual pests, and I can say I have never caught or even seen evidence of Dendrobium beetle on my Dendrobiums in this section. Probably the worst pest I have experienced is Mealybug, particularly around the flower sheaths and bracts. Mealybug can be controlled with the usual sprays.

Although my bush house is free of snails and slugs, I think that a nice juicy tender new shoot on a plant would be irresistible to one of these pests, so the usual baiting should be maintained. The only other pests that I have experienced are crickets or katydids, which seem to love to feed on fresh flowers, especially the night before the orchid meeting. If anyone knows how to keep these out of the growing areas please let me know. The only control device that I have found effective for these pests is a pair of long-nosed pliers and a size 8 boot in the early evening.
